

OxTrail is Oxfordshire's first ever art sculpture trail, which will take place in the summer of 2024. People will either paint, sponsor or find ox sculptures in various locations around the city. 
CEIAG: Government Response to Report

The Education Select Committee launched its inquiry into careers education, information, advice and guidance in January 2022 and published its report on 29 June 2023. The Government published its response to this last Thursday 21st September, stating their vision for careers and a broad summary of their, in addition to a response to each of the Committee's 27 recommendations. FE Week have published an article about the report.

The response lists three Government priorities for the next phase of reforms:

- A single, unified careers system. We want a clear and unified all-age careers system, with fully
 integrated digital and in-person services, that support individuals to move seamlessly through their
 skills, training and career journey.
- Skills, training and work experience. We want to give skills parity of esteem with academic
 pathways and to have a much stronger focus on dynamic and high-quality skills, training and work
 experience.
- Social justice. We believe that everybody, regardless of background, should be able to make the most of their talents. We want to ensure that young people and adults receive the support they




